HELPING STUDENTS DREAM BIG AND SUCCEED

FAILING TO DELIVER FOR STUDENTS

PRIORITIZE EARLY READING PROFICIENCY

Pat has worked with hundreds of PUSD students as a nonprofit leader of Friends of Madison Elementary, helping improve reading, attendance, and parent engagement.

PUTS POLITICS BEFORE KIDS

Bailey voted against expanding educational opportunities for PUSD students, including a program that would have provided immersive, outdoor learning classes.

DEMAND COMPETITIVE PAY FOR TEACHERS AND STAFF

Pat is the only candidate endorsed by United Teachers of Pasadena. Pat will ensure competitive pay to attract and retain quality educators and administrators.

REFUSES TO ADDRESS GUN SAFETY

While the unintentional deaths of small children increased by 43%, Bailey rejected an agenda item on gun safety which would have educated parents and community members on the importance of safe storage.

HOLD THE DISTRICT ACCOUNTABLE

Pat believes that the role of the school board is to keep the district accountable to student outcomes. He will advocate for investing more at school sites instead of top heavy administrative bureaucracy and ensure tax dollars are being properly spent.

APPROVED EXCESSIVE RAISE FOR FAILING SUPERINTENDENT

While teacher salaries are at the bottom in the county and more than half of third graders are not reading at their grade level, Bailey approved a four-year contract that guarantees the superintendent a \$265,000 yearly base salary, more than LAUSD's superintendent and one of the highest salaries considering the ratio to teacher pay.
